Capital Raising

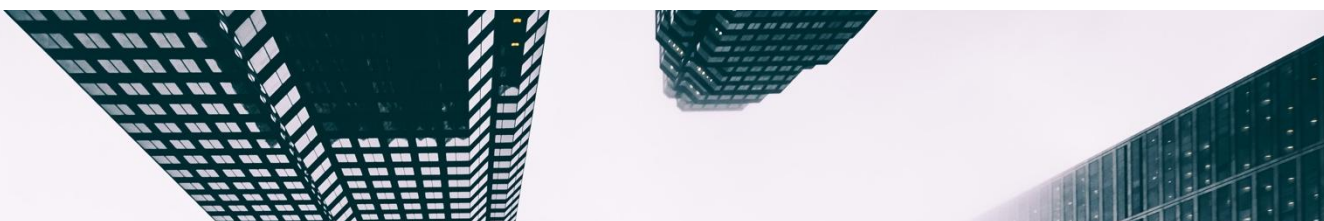
As previously announced, Investor Centre Limited (ICU or the Company) continues negotiations with a private investment company for participation in the Company which will be subject to, amongst other things, regulatory and shareholder approval. This will assist the Company moving forward with planned operations after the September quarter.

Pulse Markets

ICU's wholly owned subsidiary, Pulse Markets Pty Ltd, continues to make steady progress in its wholesale trading operations.

- A new client was onboarded during the quarter, positively contributing to monthly revenue streams.
- Pulse continues to expand its MetaTrader (MT4/MT5) Sub-License business, targeting non-Australian wholesale traders. MetaTrader, developed by MetaQuotes Software, is a widely used trading platform that requires licensing by a wholesale broker.
- Negotiations are ongoing with an Australian-based broker for the establishment of a wholesale Managed Discretionary Account (MDA) offering. This initiative is tied to the anticipated launch of the new broker, expected to commence operations in September 2025.
- Pulse also advanced discussions with a major stockbroker to act as an Introducing Broker, promoting wholesale trading services to a select group of high-net-worth clients already known to Pulse.

These initiatives align with ICU's broader strategy of growing its financial services footprint and diversifying revenue streams.
